Welcome to the September update. Summer is officially over, schools go back this week and autumn lies ahead. Let's hope for a little more sunny and warm weather before the nights draw in.

Here's my latest County Councillor update:

Highways Information

A3090 Pauncefoot Hill - contraflow for Southern Water works

A contra-flow has been put in place on the dual carriageway between Romsey and Ower to enable repairs by Southern Water to a burst 18" water main (in the newly resurfaced section of the road, which they have now dug up - I could weep).

It was put in place without notice on Friday 30th August. I've been contacted by businesses and homeowners living along the road about the lack of warning and problems with access. To be clear all businesses along that section of road remain open, most particularly <u>HAYES MUSIC</u> on Pauncefoot Hill.

I've asked HCC to intervene urgently to try and resolve, providing clearer signage and insisting on the road layout being reinstated as soon as they are able.

Their permit runs to Friday 6th September. Hopefully the work will be done and usual road layout reinstated before then.

Romsey Abbey Wildflower Meadow

If you've not had a chance to visit the Romsey Abbey wildflower meadow as yet, it's really worth taking a few minutes to visit the North Garth and see the wonderful landscape <u>Test</u> <u>Valley Borough Council</u> have created.

Back in May the Countryside Team along with Environmental Services began the process of transforming the North Church Yard at Romsey Abbey into a vibrant wildflower meadow.

After several years as part of the Urban Meadows project the meadow at the North Church Yard failed to improve in diversity on its own. The team laid a product known as Meadoscape Pro on top of the existing meadow area. The product is made up of mulch mixed with wildflower seed, giving the seed the best start to begin to grow.

Three months on and the Church yard has become a colour rich, diverse wildflower meadow, buzzing with life. At the end of the summer the meadow will be cut and collected to allow for fresh growth the following year. At this time any areas that have not established will be reseeded with a complimentary mix to ensure success the following season.
