Dear All

January is finally over, although still no news on devolution and/or Government's approval for an increase in Council Tax over the 5% limit. We expect answers on both in the coming week.

# **Highways Information**

# **Old Salisbury Lane flooding**

I'm afraid the flooding is particularly bad by the railway bridge on Old Salisbury Lane recently.

I held a meeting last month with senior highways officers to raise a concern about the ongoing problems. The drains were jetted a week ago, but clearly that has made no difference.

I have mentioned before that there are problems with the drains running through adjoining land being damaged and blocked. That issue is almost at the point of resolution, subject to the completion of some legal work needed to allow for repair. There is also though an issue with the outflow of the drain where it discharges onto the railway. Network Rail are now involved and a solution is agreed with them.

All those issues presuppose the drains in the road are fit for purpose, which patently they are not. Essentially the entire section of road needs renewed drainage, which is going to require the road to be closed while the work is undertaken. Those plans are progressing and works are scheduled for the Spring.

It is very frustrating and living within half a mile it's the issue about which I hear most (with my most vocal complainants having recently doubled now two other family members drive). There is a solution in sight, and I will keep pressing for it to be resolved promptly.

### Hampshire County Council to charge utility companies for disruptive roadworks

Before becoming Leader of the County Council last May I was responsible for highways and began the work to implement this scheme to charge utility companies for the disruptive roadworks which can blight all our days.

I'm therefore delighted my brilliant colleague Clir Lulu Bowerman has unveiled plans for a new disruption charge scheme aimed at reducing delays on the county's busiest roads during peak times.



This initiative, designed to complement the existing permitting scheme, would encourage companies and agencies to better plan their work, operate outside peak hours, and shorten the duration of their projects.

How It Works: A daily fee would be charged for the duration of the work, including any delays. Surplus revenues would fund innovative projects to reduce streetworks and roadworks disruption and will also be reinvested into highway maintenance.

Already in use in parts of the UK, 'lane rental' charges apply to the most congested, strategically important local roads. Hampshire could charge up to £2,500 per day, the maximum allowed under current legislation.

# Food recycling on the way for Test Valley residents!

TVBC is one step closer to launching kerbside food waste collections for households across the borough later this year!

This week at our Cabinet meeting we recommended starting food waste collections on 13 October 2025. This is ahead of the government's requirement for all councils to have food waste collections in place by 1 April 2026, thanks to the Environment Act 2021.

TVBC is pushing to introduce the collections five months early, marking a positive step towards transforming recycling in the area.

The new weekly service will see kerbside food waste caddies collected from households across the borough by a new fleet of specialist collection vehicles.

Residents in flats or shared accommodations will also get communal food waste bins, and every household will receive a smaller kitchen caddy to help collect food waste and scraps at home.

Once collected, the food waste will be taken to an anaerobic digestion facility where it will be broken down to produce methane-rich biogas for fuel and nutrient-rich fertiliser.

The government will cover ongoing service costs from 1 April 2026 through New Burdens funding. However, rolling out the service earlier will cost the council around £390,000, with the final decision to be made by full council on 29 January 2025.

## Waltet, Bunny Lane – planning application

Last month HCC's Regulatory Committee considered the application to allow a permanent increase in the stockpile heights at the Waltet recycling site on Bunny Lane.

I was delighted that the officer's report recommended this application should be refused and that the committee unanimously backed that view.

I spoke at the committee meeting as the local County Councillor, highlighting the fact that the company had agreed to a permanent reduction in the height of the mounds of earth and rubble they hold on site in various planning permissions over the last few years and most particularly as part of the justification for their placing a wash plant on the site in 2021.

The impact on the landscape and the disturbance caused by machinery operating on and around the mounds at their current height is detrimental to the surrounding community in Michelmersh and Timsbury. It's now time for the company to enact their original promise to reduce the height of the mounds, and to do so quickly.

## Major Investment in Special Needs Education for Next Academic Year.

One of the greatest pressures on Hampshire County Council's budget is the cost of the increasing number of school pupils with Special Education Needs. Therefore we have announced exciting plans to transform specialist education at four primary schools, significantly boosting support for pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in Gosport, Eastleigh, and Basingstoke.

Holbrook Primary School, Gosport: Expanding provision for children with Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) by an extra nine places from September 2025. Refurbishing an unused meeting room and improving hygiene spaces with a capital investment of £350,000.

Cherbourg Primary School, Eastleigh: Expanding Social, Emotional, and Mental Health (SEMH) provision from seven to 11 places. Receiving revenue funding



for the additional places, with no associated capital costs.

**Bedenham Primary School, Gosport:** 

Increasing SEMH resourced provision from 12 to 18 places by September 2025. Refurbishing an unused classroom, toilets, and external area with a capital investment of £360,000.

Saxon Wood School, Basingstoke:

Adjusting existing specialist provision to also meet the needs of children with Severe Learning Difficulties (SLD) and Moderate Learning Difficulties (MLD).

Enhancing the breadth of provision at no additional capital cost.

We are committed to supporting Hampshire children, whatever their needs, with educational opportunities to achieve their potential within their home communities wherever possible. Keeping such provision within our own successful schools saves costs that would otherwise be spent on special needs provision in the independent sector, often taking children far from their peers and families.

These expansions are in addition to plans for a new SEMH special school in Eastleigh, set to open in September 2026, and further specialist places at three other schools from September 2025.
